

AN ORDINANCE LIMITING PUBLIC USE OF PRIVATE PROPERTY AND PROVIDING PENALTY FOR VIOLATION

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Town of Sibley, Louisiana, in regular session convened on July 5, 1976, as follows:

SECTION 1: That it shall hereinafter be unlawful, after the hour of 12:00 P.M. (midnight), for any person to come upon or remain on or about the premises, grounds or parking lots of any private business which has closed its doors to business for that day. Excepted from the operation of this ordinance are:

- [1]. The owner or operator of the business establishment;
- [2]. Any employee of the business establishment who is on a mission directly related to his employment;
- [3]. Any member of the immediate family of the owner or operator of the business establishment who is on a mission directly related to the operation of the business, or who is on a family mission which causes the said family member to be on or about the premises of the business or on or about the parking lot of the business establishment; and
- [4]. Firemen and officers of the law in the course and scope of their official duties.

SECTION 2: That for the violation of this Ordinance and upon conviction thereof in the Town Court of Sibley, Louisiana, there shall be assessed a fine of not more than One Hundred and No/100 (\$100.00) Dollars, or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or both fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.
